

Public Consultation on Five Potential SVHC under EU REACH Regulation

The European Chemical Agency has launched a new public consultation concerning five potential SVHC. Stakeholders can provide comments on these proposed SVHC until 17 April 2020. Comments will be taken into account when deciding whether the substances will be added to the ECHA Candidate List of SVHC.



Background

On 03 March 2020, the European Chemicals Agency (ECHA) published five new potential Substances of Very High Concern (SVHC) candidates (see table). After preparing dossiers for the substances, the ECHA has now invited interested parties to a public consultation in which they can provide comments within a timeframe of 45 days (until 17 April 2020).

A decision will be made as to whether the substances will be included to the ECHA Candidate List of SVHC after the consultation.

The Five Potential SVHCs:

1-vinylimidazole	1072-63-5 (214-012-0)	Toxic for reproduction (Article 57c)
2-methylimidazole	693-98-1 (211-765-7)	Toxic for reproduction (Article 57c)
Butyl 4-hydroxybenzoate	94-26-8 (202-318-7)	Equivalent level of concern having probable serious effects on the human health (Article 57f) - Endocrine disrupting properties
Dibutylbis(pentane-2,4-dionato-O,O')tin	22673-19-4 (245-152-0)	Toxic for reproduction (Article 57c)
Resorcinol	108-46-3 (203-585-2)	Equivalent level of concern having probable serious effects on the human health (Article 57f) - Endocrine disrupting properties
